

# 3D Paper Roses

Made with Stampin' Up!'s ® *Hot Air Balloon Punch*

## Supplies –

**Card Stock:** Cherry Cobbler, Garden Green, Blushing Bride

**Punch:** Hot Air Balloon

**Tools and Adhesive:** Bone Folder, Paper Snips, Multipurpose Liquid Glue (or a *Glue Gun*)

## Instructions -

**Step 1** – Punch out 6 balloon shapes using the *Hot Air Balloon Punch* from *Cherry Cobbler Card Stock*.

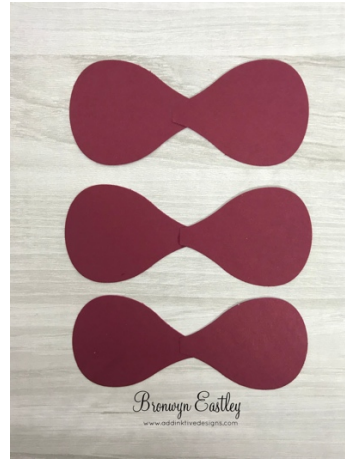
**Step 2** – Glue two pieces together at the narrow sections as shown (x3).

**Step 3** – Punch out four more balloons and curve the sides of the petals inward using a *Bone Folder*.

**Step 4** – Punch out four more balloons and with a *Bone Folder*, curve the tops of the petals outwards.

**Step 5** – Punch out another four balloons and cut off the narrow section on each with *Paper Snips*. Curl each of the sides of the petals upward with a *Bone Folder*.

**Step 6** – Punch out three balloons from *Garden Green Card Stock* and make a crease half way down the middle of each with a *Bone Folder*.

**Step 7** – Take one of the double petal pieces from Step 1 and curl up one side tightly as shown. Glue into place.

**Step 8** – Fold up the other piece and curl around the other (slightly more loosely than the first). Glue the petals into place.

**Step 9** – With the other two double petals, curl up the sides with a *Bone Folder*.

**Step 10** – Add glue to the sections as shown in the photo.

**Step 11** – Place one double petal underneath the rolled rose and adhere into place making the gap between the petals a fraction wider on both sides.

It should look something like this.

**Step 12** – Repeat steps 10 and 11 with the second double petal.



**Step 13** – Using two of the single petals from Step 3, glue to the sides as shown leaving a bit of a gap between the last layer of petals.

**Step 14** – Repeat with the other two petals on the opposite sides.

Looking good so far!



**Step 15** – With the curved petals from Step 4, add glue to the inside, lower, narrow section on each and glue one to each side. **These form the outer petal layers.**

**Step 16** – There's quite a gap between the outer petals and the last inner layer so this is where the petals from Step 5 will be added. Add glue to the inside, straight edge of the four petals and adhere one to each side of the last inner layer.

**Step 17** – Glue the leaves from Step 6 underneath the rose and curl upwards after the glue has set.

Add as an embellishment to a *Home Décor* piece or to pretty up some packaging.

Make some in your favourite floral colours. Here's one made from *Blushing Bride Card Stock* -
